	B. C. D. E.	The life, death, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus Christ provide the only way of salvation. A person receives Spirit baptism at salvation as a sign that they are forgiven of their sins. Our salvation is assured by the Holy Spirit as we remain obedient and keep our faith in Christ. Sanctification allows for a Christian to live a sinless life after they have received salvation. The salvation provided by Christ brings believers liberation from slavery to sin and evil, and includes healing, in various forms, as a foretaste of future restoration. Christ's salvation provides believers with the opportunity to seek for healing today through prayer. Healing is assured if a person has enough faith.		
5.	SPIRIT BAPTISM			
	B. C. D. E.	Spirit baptism is an experience separate from being born again. The sign of speaking in tongues indicates that believers have been baptized with the Holy Spirit. A believer may be baptized in the Holy Spirit without the sign of speaking in tongues. Spirit baptism always occurs at the same time as the experience of the new birth. Speaking in tongues provides assurance to the believer of their sanctification. The purpose of Spirit baptism is empowered speech and action for effective witness of the Lord Jesus Christ

	B.	Jesus Christ provides a delegated authority to ordained pastors to be the head of the church. The universal church is made up of those who have been Spirit baptized with the sign of tongues.
